SALINAS, Dec. 22.—(P)—The temporary injunction granted at San Francisco to a group of Salinas agricultural workers will have little efsect on activities of the Grower-Vegetable Association. Charles S. Brooks, secretary, said

Since lettuce operations have ceased for the Winter "the injunction has no bearing except that we will not be able to issue recommendation cards to satisfactory workers," Brooks stated.

Association had "blacklisted" workers who participated in the strike here several months ago and that is had threatened reprisals against shippers who employed the men.

The injunction was issued in Federal court on application of J. B. Alberty, Earl Mongomery, John S. Wiseman. John Novak and George Foote. The men charged that the association and 50 other defendants were discriminating against them and other workers, who participated in the strike.


