Graduates of Arkansas College Number Fourteen, Largest in History of Institution.

The largest graduating class in the history of Arkansas College will go from this institution next Wednesday. The degree of Bachelor of Arts is to be conferred upon fourteen. The commencement exercises will begin on next Sabbath morning at 11 with the baccalaureate sermon by Rev. French W. Thompson of New Albany, Ind., an alumnus of the college. On Sabbath evening at 8 o'clock the sermon to the Y. M. C. A. will be delivered by Rev. Geo. T. McKee of Muto, Africa, another alumnus. Monday at 8 p. m. the oratorical contest between representatives of the Philomathean and Erosophic societies, two from each, and the delivery of the medal to the best orator will take place. Tuesday at 8 p. m. the banquet given to the alumni will be enjoyed in the dining rooms of the boys' dormitory with Prof. Sidney Pickens, the president of the association, as toastmaster. Many alumni from abroad are expected at this homecoming. Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock will be the regular commencement exercises, consisting of presentation of diplomas and medals and the alumni address by Judge L. B. Poindexter of Black Rock, Ark. All of the exercises will be held in the Alumni Hall. Miss Nesbitt will have an art display in the Y. M. C. A. Hall, beginning Wednesday at 9 a. m. and lasting through the day. The music for the week-day programs will be under the superintendence of the Misses Rutherford and Fitzhugh. Everybody cordially invited.
