I have had called to my attention an unwarranted attack upon our Liberty Loan schedule of publicity. The attack which was generally sent over the entire district, including your own State, and the sleeping car which quarantined the Great Lakes Band were furnished to the Liberty Loan Organization by and at the direction of Mr. McAdoo, director of railroads.

We are extremely regretful that there has been any attack upon you personally as a result of your address in Arkansas when a member of the party accompanying the Great Lakes Band. You were requested, like many other men in public life, to lend your services during the Liberty Loan campaign, and were delegated by this organization to accompany this particular party for several days. Therefore, any adverse comment growing from your acceptance is unwarranted.
